4-H Project Poster Tips

From 4-H Volunteers

Many of our 4-H projects depend on a poster for judging or display during the fair. Remember the purpose of the poster is to share what you have learned and introduce a new topic of interest to the observer. You just might inspire another kid to join 4-H or try a new project! Here are a few helpful tips from a retired school teacher and 4-H volunteer that will help you get started.

- 1. Be sure your poster has a title.
- 2. Have your name and club clearly written on the <u>front</u> of the poster.
- 3. Have a neat border around the outer edge of the poster.
- 4. Any printing or writing should be very neat and written on a straight edge.
- 5. Do not use pencil in writing. Use black marker or stencil for clear writing.
- 6. Be sure your poster coves the facts of your topic.
- 7. Keep it simple, neat and organized.
- 8. Bright colors are often eye catching.
- 9. Don't wait to the last minute to make your poster (it shows).
- 10. Keep your poster neat after it is finished by <u>not</u> rolling or folding it up and <u>not</u> letting it get torn or ripped.
